TENEBRE SERVICE

The word 'tenebrae' is Latin for shadows. The purpose of the Tenebrae service is to recreate in a liturgical way the emotional aspects of the passion story. The service was originally designed for Good Friday, but it can be used for Holy Thursday and Holy Saturday as well. The service may include the recitation of Psalms or other parts, such as solemn hymns and prayers. As the Liturgy of the Hours is prayed, the Tenebrae service continues with the progressive extinguishing of candles until the final candle is put out, leaving the congregation in near symbolic darkness—at which point, the service ends. The people leave in silence. The purpose of the service is to recreate the betrayal, abandonment, and agony of the events of Jesus' Death and Resurrection, and it is left unfinished, because the story is not over until Easter Day.
