**NOTES FROM THE LOFT**

For the SEVENTEETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME  
 July 25, 2010

The Assumption Choirs – both Adult and Children’s – are privileged to enhance the Sacred Liturgy with the offering of their song. In addition to the music in our missalette, they are increasingly drawing on their harmonized repertoire and the Church’s treasury of Latin hymns and chants. “Notes from the Loft” will provide insights into the selections and translations for the Latin texts in order to deepen our appreciation of the readings and music for the coming Sunday. The readings for July 25 stress the power of prayer: prayer of intercession and prayer of supplication. “PARCE DOMINE”, traditionally sung during Lent, will be chanted at the Offertory. It echoes Abraham’s prayer of intercession, pleading, “Spare Your People, Lord. Be not angry with us forever.” Teaching His disciples the Lord’s Prayer, Jesus urges us to ask for both our bodily and spiritual needs, including the great gift of the Holy Spirit. The “VENI, SANCTE SPIRITUS” will be chanted in both English and Latin as the first Communion hymn. Full text is on page 175 of the Missalette.

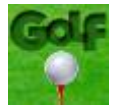

## CELEBRATING THE FEAST OF THE ASSUMPTION 2010

*In order to celebrate our patronal feast, Assumption parish honors our Mother Mary's entrance body and soul into to heaven with various religious, social and cultural elements this year:*

### FORTY HOURS DEVOTION

As we celebrated in anticipating our 150th Anniversary in 2009, once again we will expose the Blessed Sacrament for 40 consecutive hours (with the exception of Holy Mass) in the ancient practice known as "Forty Hours." Starting at 7:00 PM on Thursday, August 13 and concluding at 11:00 AM on Saturday, August 14, 2010, the Forty Hours Devotion requests parishioners to sign up to accompany our Lord in the Most Blessed Sacrament in one hour slots. Signups will take place in the weeks before.

### A TRIDUUM OF MASS

Embedded in the Forty Hours Devotion will be three Masses (in addition to our usual Mass schedule): one in English to open the Devotion at 7:00 p.m. on Thursday, August 12, 2010; one in Spanish to close out the Devotion at 10:00 AM on Saturday, August 14, 2010; and one in Italian and English at 5:00 PM on Friday, August 13, 2010 that will also serve to open the Peekskill Festa Italiana that will take place in downtown Peekskill (South Street) in honor of the Feast of the Assumption.

### PEEKSKILL FESTA ITALIANA

Sponsored by the Peekskill Italian Festival Committee, this three day old-styled Italian festival in honor of the Feast of the Assumption will take place over the course of three days: August 13th, 14th and 15th. It will include food, entertainment, games of chance, fun for kids and the whole family. On Sunday, August 15th the Festa will open with a 12 Noon multilingual Mass in honor of the Assumption of our Lady and a procession to the site of the Festival on South.

### MULTILINGUAL MASS AND PROCESSION

The culmination of our Patronal Feast will be a solemn Multilingual Mass offered on the actual Feast of the Assumption, August 15th at 12:00 noon. The Vicar General of the Archdiocese of New York, Bishop Dennis Sullivan will be the main celebrant. The Mass will end with a procession of our famous painting of Mary Assumed into heaven (accompanied by the Gentleman of our Lady) to the site of the Feast where the liturgical component will ends while the Feast continues into the early evening.

### MISSIONARY COOP

As is required once a year by the Archdiocese of New York, each parish welcomes a missionary group to speak at all of the Sunday Masses and to take up a second collection. Assumption Church warmly welcomes the Maryknoll Sisters who will speak on the weekend of July 31 and August 1, 2010. Please be as generous as your means allow. Please note that we will postpone the collection (*Catholic Home Mission/ Latin America*) for the following week (August 7 & 8).
