**NOTES FROM THE LOFT**

**18th SUNDAY Ordinary Time August 1, 2010**

The readings for Sunday, August 1, have urgency about them: this world is passing away! WE are passing away!! Although inspired by the Holy Spirit, the human authors of the First Reading and the Psalm, however, are not privileged to know about great graces that are yet to be given to a struggling, mortal humanity: the gift of a loving Mother, who would also be the Mother of the Eucharist. The Gregorian chant, ALMA REDEMPTORIS MATER, sung during the incensing, is a cry for help: "Loving Mother of the Redeemer, open door to Heaven and Star of the Sea, come quickly to the aid of your people, fallen indeed, but striving to stand again. To nature's astonishment, you were the mother of your holy Creator without ceasing to be a virgin, and heard from Gabriel that greeting, 'Hail Have pity on us sinners!' The Communion song, ECCE PANIS ANGELORUM, reminds us that God provides Food unto eternal life: "Behold the Bread of Angels, made Food for pilgrims, true children's Bread, not to be given to the dogs." (Matt 15:26)

**19th SUNDAY Ordinary Time August 8, 2010**

The readings for next Sunday, August 8, continue to call us to have faith and trust in God, as did our father, Abraham. Our home is not in this world, but in Heaven. Our Father is most willing to give us the Kingdom, promised and won for us by the Blood of His Son, who sacrificed Himself once and for all, giving His flesh as food for the life of the world! We wait in joyful expectation and longing for His Second Coming. To be sung as the priest offers the sacrificial gifts, JESU, SALVATOR MUNDI, is a loving call from God's children: "Jesus, Savior of the world, come to Thy servants and handmaids Whom Thou hast redeemed with Thy most Precious Blood!"

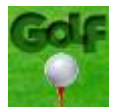
## CCD REGISTRATION

## CELEBRATING THE FEAST OF THE ASSUMPTION 2010

*In order to celebrate our patronal feast, Assumption parish honors our Mother Mary's entrance body and soul into to heaven with various religious, social and cultural elements this year:*

### FORTY HOURS DEVOTION

As we celebrated in anticipating our 150th Anniversary in 2009, once again we will expose the Blessed Sacrament for 40 consecutive hours (with the exception of Holy Mass) in the ancient practice known as "Forty Hours." Starting at 7:00 PM on Thursday, August 13 and concluding at 11:00 AM on Saturday, August 14, 2010, the Forty Hours Devotion requests parishioners to sign up to accompany our Lord in the Most Blessed Sacrament in one hour slots. Signups will take place in the weeks before.

### A TRIDUUM OF MASS

Embedded in the Forty Hours Devotion will be three Masses (in addition to our usual Mass schedule): one in English to open the Devotion at 7:00 p.m. on Thursday, August 12, 2010; one in Spanish to close out the Devotion at 10:00 AM on Saturday, August 14, 2010; and one in Italian and English at 5:00 PM on Friday, August 13, 2010 that will also serve to open the Peekskill Festa Italiana that will take place in downtown Peekskill (South Street) in honor of the Feast of the Assumption.

### PEEKSKILL FESTA ITALIANA

Sponsored by the Peekskill Italian Festival Committee, this three day old-styled Italian festival in honor of the Feast of the Assumption will take place over the course of three days: August 13th, 14th and 15th. It will include food, entertainment, games of chance, fun for kids and the whole family. On Sunday, August 15th the Festa will open with a 12 Noon multilingual Mass in honor of the Assumption of our Lady and a procession to the site of the Festival on South.

### MULTILINGUAL MASS AND PROCESSION

The culmination of our Patronal Feast will be a solemn Multilingual Mass offered on the actual Feast of the Assumption, August 15th at 12:00 noon. The Vicar General of the Archdiocese of New York, Bishop Dennis Sullivan will be the main celebrant. The Mass will end with a procession of our famous painting of Mary Assumed into heaven (accompanied by the Gentleman of our Lady) to the site of the Feast where the liturgical component will ends while the Feast continues into the early evening.
